


Agog Grants



General Guidelines

- Most grants are \$50,000-\$100,000
- Grants must be made to a 501(c)3 organization or equivalent
 - Projects may be supported via a fiscal sponsor.
 - For non-US projects, Agog can pursue an equivalency determination to establish eligibility.
- Most grants are for project-specific support
- Agog does not accept unsolicited proposals


Topical Areas of Focus


